## **Program Summary**

This presentation will address the basics of bankruptcy practice, from the debtor's filing of the petition to the final distribution. The presenter will provide an overview of bankruptcy code chapters and case filings and cover claims, automatic stays, discharges and the case process, including bankruptcy issues that government attorneys face in their cases.

#### **Eligibility**
