Program Summary

No Supreme Court decision on criminal law is more misunderstood than Miranda v. Arizona. This presentation will cover many of the most common myths and misconceptions about Miranda. Prosecutors will develop a better understanding of the legal standards applicable to Fifth Amendment jurisprudence so they can make all reasonable arguments on behalf of the State in court and provide sound advice to law enforcement officers in the field.

Eligibility

This program is intended for attorneys in the Division of Criminal Justice and county prosecutors' offices. However, it is open to all attorneys in the Department of Law and Public Safety. Registrants will receive the course materials prior to the program date.

Faculty

Daniel I. Bornstein is retired from the Division of Criminal Justice, where he was an AAG and Counsel to the Director. Before taking that position, he served as Chief of DCJ's Appellate Bureau, where he managed appeals before the New Jersey Supreme Court and Appellate Division. Mr. Bornstein handled habeas petitions before the United States District Court and Third Circuit Court of Appeals and provided trial and appellate assistance to assistant prosecutors and DAsG across the State. He also served in the Gangs & Organized Crime Bureau, where he successfully prosecuted and tried cases involving homicide, racketeering, and weapons and narcotics offenses, including several multi-defendant wiretap cases. Mr. Bornstein graduated magna cum laude from Colgate University, received a J.D. from the University of Pennsylvania Law School and clerked for the Honorable Martin J. Kole, J.A.D., t/a, and the Honorable Theodore A. Winard, J.S.C.
