Program Summary

This program will provide Health and Human Services deputies with an introduction on how to handle matters on behalf of the New Jersey Office of Vital Statistics and State Registry. The presenter will highlight the most common vital statistics matters handled by HHS, survey controlling statutes and regulations, identify potential pitfalls, and provide practice tips to promote successful representation from assignment to closing.

Eligibility

Registration is limited to Deputy Attorneys General in the Division of Law's Health and Human Services Section and Assistant Attorneys General in the Trenton Administrative Practice Group. Registrants will receive the course materials prior to the program date.
