Program Summary

This program will focus on how to present an effective closing argument that leaves a lasting impression. The presenter will help students develop a closing that integrates the legal, factual and persuasive elements of their case theory, captures the jury's attention, summarizes the testimony and evidence and persuades the jury to find in favor of their side.

Eligibility

This program is intended for deputy and assistant attorneys general in the Division of Law and is mandatory for DOL deputies who are registered for the August 2021 Civil Trial Advocacy Program. However, DAsG and AAsG in other divisions of the Department of Law and Public Safety are also eligible to attend. Registrants will receive the course materials prior to the program date.

Faculty

Lisa Dorio Ruch. Esq. is a Staff Agent at the New Jersey Public Employment Relations Commission (PERC), where she mediates and serves as a hearing officer for disputes involving public employers, employees, and labor unions. Prior to joining PERC, Lisa was a Deputy Attorney General with Department of Law and Public Safety, Division of Law's Personnel, Community Affairs and Elections Section, handling a wide variety of civil service employment and labor matters in both trial and appellate courts, including the Third Circuit. Before serving as a Deputy Attorney General, Ms. Ruch was in private practice and served as a law clerk to the Honorable Marie Garibaldi of the New Jersey Supreme Court. Ms. Ruch holds a J.D. from Columbia University School of Law and a B.A. from Douglass College/Rutgers University.
