## **Program Summary**

"What is Zoom?" - said most lawyers until March 2020. The electric typewriter. The photocopy machine. Sound and video recording devices. The internet. There was a time when all of this was new technology and lawyers couldn't imagine if and how it would fit into their practice. The next iteration in this evolutionary process is blockchain. Over the past few years, the term "blockchain" has become synonymous with cryptocurrency (a.k.a. "bitcoin") but its applications far exceed that. It may seem mysterious or complicated, but blockchain technology is already being used in many legal arenas and it will undoubtedly become commonplace in the near future to provide data transparency, reliability, and security in business and legal transactions.

This program will help you to understand blockchain technology in a clear, accessible manner, including how it can be applied in the practice of law. Attendees will gain a working knowledge of the theory behind blockchain, as well as a virtual roadmap showing how it is utilized today. The presenters will discuss what blockchain technology is, how it works and why it is important. The program will also cover practical ways that blockchain will someday be used in the legal profession, including safeguarding data and confidential information, tracking the chain of custody of evidence, real and personal property, creating "smart contracts" that are self-executing and expediting contract review. By the end of the program, blockchain will evolve from a mysterious new technology to an innovative tool that students can envision using in the future.
