# WEBINAR

## Program Summary

This program will cover constitutional issues relating to the Fifth and Sixth Amendments, as well as eyewitness identification proceedings pursuant to <u>Wade</u>, <u>Henderson</u>, and Rule 3:11.

## Eligibility

This program is mandatory for new assistant prosecutors and Division of Criminal Justice deputies hired after October 2020 who have been selected to attend by each county prosecutor's office and the Division of Criminal Justice. Other assistant prosecutors and Division of Criminal Justice deputies are welcome to register.

#### Faculty

**William P. Miller** is the Chief Assistant Prosecutor of the Bergen County Prosecutor's Office Appellate Section. AP Miller briefs appeals, argues them in appellate courts and advises assistant prosecutors on their trial prosecutions. Prior to joining the BCPO, he served as a law clerk for New Jersey Supreme Court Justice Helen E. Hoens. AP Miller received a B.A. from the College of William and Mary and a J.D. from Rutgers Law School-Newark, where he was a member of the law review.

**Ian Kennedy** is an Assistant Prosecutor in the Bergen County Prosecutor's Office Appellate Section. Prior to joining the BCPO, he was a Deputy Attorney General in the Division of Criminal Justice's Appellate Bureau and worked for a short period in private practice. In these positions, he briefed and argued cases in the Law Division, Appellate Division, and Supreme Court of New Jersey, in addition to litigating cases before the United States District Court. AP Kennedy served as a law clerk in the Appellate Division for the Honorable Carmen Messano, P.J.A.D. He received a B.A. from Union College, magna cum laude, and as J.D. from Boston College Law School, magna cum laude.
