# **Program Summary**

This program will provide a primer on elder law, including how it differs from traditional estate planning. Disability planning (including powers of attorney for finances and health), estate planning (including wills and trusts), and administration and management of trusts for long-term care asset protection will be discussed from an elder law perspective. The course will also provide guidance on how to plan for long-term care, including financing, current Medicaid regulations, VA benefits and long-term care insurance.

#### **Eligibility**

This program is open to attorneys in the Department of Law and Public Safety and county prosecutors' offices. Registrants will receive the course materials prior to the program date.

#### **Faculty**
