Program Summary

This program will educate attorneys about the psychology of juror decision making and its application to voir dire and jury selection. The presenter will discuss strategies and methods to help attorneys overcome communication obstacles and conduct more effective voir dire. Attendees will learn about biases jurors bring to the courtroom that influence their perceptions of the trial. The presenter will provide entertaining and useful information on juror psychology, with an emphasis on practical advice to apply academic studies of jury psychology and jury research to cases faced by prosecutors.
