Program Summary

This course will introduce DAsG in the Division of Law's Health and Human Services Section to appellate writing and appellate practice. The presenter will provide a primer on appellate practice, including the Division of Law's appellate procedures, common appeals handled in the Health and Human Services Section, the applicable standards of review, brief structure, argument presentation, and writing tips.

DAG Stephen Slocum is an assistant section chief in the Health and Human Services Section of the Division of Law. His practice primarily focuses on Medicaid cases and the Sexually Violent Predators Act.
