Program Summary

This course will introduce DAsG in the Division of Law's Health and Human Services Section to DHS Policy Circular P1.09, which requires the review and approval of all mergers, acquisitions, affiliations, changes in ownership and other transactions affecting DHS contracts. The presenter will provide a primer on the P1.09 review process, outlining primary issues of concern and reviewing the most common documents involved in the review, such as the Standard Language Document, assignments of contract, capital funding agreements, and mortgages.
