Program Summary

New Jersey county boards and superintendents of elections are responsible for conducting voter registration and elections in compliance with applicable State statutes. This program will provide an overview of the statutory and case law governing elections in New Jersey, including:

- Voter registration
- Early voting
- Voting by mail
- Ballot drop boxes
- Use of provisional ballots versus emergency ballots
- Using authorized messengers to receive ballots and designated bearers to return ballots
- What constitutes electioneering and prohibitions against electioneering
- Election challengers

Eligibility

This program is mandatory for Division of Law Deputy Attorneys General hired after October 2022 who have not previously completed the Basic Civil and Administrative Practice (BCAP) series of courses. DOL deputies who are required to take this program must register for all BCAP sessions.

Other Division of Law deputies are welcome to attend this program. Registrants will receive the course materials prior to the program date.

Faculty

DAG Nicole Adams is an Assistant Section Chief in the Community Affairs, State and Elections Section of the Division of Law. She handles a variety of election matters, including client advice and litigation. Prior to becoming an Assistant Section Chief, she was a line deputy in the State Police, Employment and Corrections Section. She is a graduate of the University of Delaware and Drexel University School of Law.

SDAG George Cohen is a member of the Community Affairs, State and Elections Section of the Division of Law. He has provided legal guidance to a host of State agency clients, including years of hands-on experience with New Jersey's election laws. SDAG Cohen has handled sensitive election law cases addressing the adequacy of electronic voting machines, an attack on statutory voter registration deadlines and a constitutional challenge to residency and registration requirements for persons circulating nominating petitions. He holds a B.A. from the University of Pennsylvania and a J.D. from the Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law of Yeshiva University.
