Program Summary

This program will provide an overview of recent developments in election law, including new laws that have been enacted since May 2022. The presenters will discuss the role of deputies representing their clients in the areas of electronic poll books, early voting, law enforcement presence at polling places and ballot drop box locations, and the extension of the 100-foot electioneering prohibition to ballot drop boxes.

Eligibility
