### *Program Summary*

Depositions are one of the most useful tools in an attorney's discovery arsenal. This program will detail how to extract necessary information and obtain admissions when deposing witnesses. The presenter will also offer strategies for defending clients in a deposition.

### *Eligibility*

### *Faculty*

**DAG Nicholas Kant** is the Assistant Section Chief in the Banking and Insurance Section of the Division of Law. He previously served in the Consumer Fraud Prosecution and the Government & Healthcare Fraud Sections of the Division of Law. He also served on mobility assignment in the Governor's Authorities Unit, where he oversaw and advised State and multi-state agencies on a wide variety of matters, including as a voting board member of the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority and the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission. He was a law clerk with Honorable Ronald G. Marmo (Ret.) in New Jersey Superior Court, Passaic County, Criminal Division and received a J.D. from the University of Colorado School of Law.
