Program Summary

This program will detail how the New Jersey Division of Law's Data Privacy and Cybersecurity Section (DPC) protects the privacy of New Jersey residents by investigating companies suffering data breaches and holding technology platforms, including social media platforms, accountable. The presenters will discuss the DPC's legal authority, investigative process, and recent settlements, including the Google location tracking case and the Weichert and Wawa data breaches.

Eligibility

This program is open to attorneys in the Department of Law and Public Safety and county prosecutors' offices.

Faculty

DAG Kashif Chand is the Section Chief of the Division of Law's Data Privacy & Cybersecurity Section. He was a line deputy in this section before being promoted to Section Chief. Prior to joining the Division of Law, DAG Chand worked as a litigator at several New Jersey law firms and served two years in a federal clerkship with the Honorable James B. Clark, III. He graduated from Rutgers University with a B.A. in Chemistry and earned his J.D. from Rutgers School of Law in Newark.

DAG Thomas Huynh is the Assistant Section Chief of the Division of Law's Data Privacy & Cybersecurity Section. Prior to joining DOL, he was a DAG in the Division of Criminal Justice. He clerked in the Appellate Division following graduation from law school. DAG Huynh earned a B.A. from George Washington University, an M.A. from Binghamton University and a J.D. from Seton Hall University School of Law.
