Program Summary

This program will cover disaster response and recovery law, including examples of legal guidance form Superstorm Sandy, COVID-19, and other major disasters.

Eligibility

This program is open to attorneys in the Department of Law and Public Safety and county prosecutors' offices.

Faculty

Dan Kelly is the Executive Director of the Governor's Disaster Recovery Office, where he coordinates the State's emergency response to catastrophic events like Superstorm Sandy, COVID-19, and Tropical Storm Ida. He is also responsible for the oversight and strategic coordination of billions of dollars in federal funds dedicated to disaster recovery and resilience projects. Prior to joining the Governor's Office, Director Kelly was an Assistant Attorney General serving as the Director of the Superstorm Sandy Compliance Unit at the New Jersey Office of the Attorney General. He was chiefly responsible for defending the State against federal audits of Sandy funds and provided legal guidance on disaster recovery matters to the Attorney General, the Governor's Office, and numerous State agencies. Before that, he was a Deputy Attorney General in the Division of Law, where he represented the State in civil litigation matters. Director Kelly received an undergraduate degree from the University of Pittsburgh and a Juris Doctor from Villanova Law School.
