Program Summary

Document production for litigation, OPRA or media requests often requires redaction of certain information for reasons of confidentiality or privilege. To effectively and completely redact documents, employees should always use the redaction tool in Adobe software. Using alternative redaction methods in lieu of Adobe may inadvertently disclose information intended to be removed from a document, which can damage litigation positions, disrupt claims of privilege, or allow prohibited access to otherwise restricted information. This program will provide a primer on using the Adobe redaction tool. Employees will learn how to use Adobe to effectively redact documents, protecting the confidential elements of information that is subject to disclosure.

Eligibility

This program is open to attorneys and support staff in the Department of Law & Public Safety and county prosecutors' offices.
