Program Summary

This program will detail how the New Jersey Division of Law's Data Privacy and Cybersecurity Section (DPC) protects the privacy of New Jersey residents by investigating companies suffering data breaches and holding technology platforms, including social media platforms, accountable. The presenters will discuss the DPC's legal authority, investigative process, and recent settlements. The program will also provide an overview of New Jersey's data privacy law which will become effective in January 2025.
