Program Summary

What's your first thought when you get a 20-page handwritten complaint that is not only illegible, but unintelligible? How do you respond to citations from the Bible, Magna Carta, and the Declaration of Independence? If a *pro se* litigant calls the office and wants to speak with you, what do you do? This program will cover how to handle the myriad of issues that arise when you are assigned matters involving *pro se* litigants. The presenter will offer practical tips on brief writing and communicating with your adversary and the court. This program will also give you the tools and strategies to confidently handle and resolve these matters.
