Program Summary

This course will provide a brief overview of the most significant criminal appeals likely to be argued in the New Jersey Supreme Court and the New Jersey Appellate Division during the 2024-2025 Court Term.

Eligibility

This program is designed for attorneys in the Division of Criminal Justice and county prosecutors' offices. However, it is open to all deputy and assistant attorneys general in the Department of Law and Public Safety.

Faculty

DAG Bethany Deal serves in the Division of Criminal Justice's Appellate Bureau, where she litigates criminal appeals in the Appellate Division and Supreme Court. Prior to joining the Division, DAG Deal was an Assistant Prosecutor in the Burlington County Prosecutor's Office for nearly 13 years before becoming the Chief of the Grand Jury/Screening Unit in 2017. She clerked for the Honorable Jeanne T. Covert, J.A.D. DAG Deal graduated with a B.A., *summa cum laude*, from Villanova University, and a J.D., *cum laude* from Villanova Law School.

DAG Kaili Matthews serves in the Division of Criminal Justice's Appellate Bureau, where she

litigates criminal appeals before the New Jersey Appellate Division and Supreme Court, as well as the Federal District and Supreme Court. She is a member of the Bureau's working teams on Identifications, Sentencing/Sex Offenders, Trial Issues/Evidence, DNA, and Criminal Justice Reform. Prior to joining the Division, DAG Matthews clerked for the Honorable Hany A. Mawla, J.A.D. She received two A.A.s from Rowan College, a B.A. from Rider University, and a J.D., *cum laude*, from Rutgers Law School.
