Program Summary

This program will explore how to efficiently and effectively prepare for a civil jury trial. The presenter will condense trial preparation into fifteen steps, beginning with the closing argument and the verdict sheet. These steps will serve as a guide for preparing everything leading up to the closing, including the opening statement, direct and cross examination, client and witnesses preparation, motions *in limine*, and motions to dismiss at the end of plaintiff's case.

Eligibility

This program is designed for attorneys in the Division of Law. However, it is open to all deputy and assistant attorneys general in the Department of Law and Safety.

Faculty

DAG Brian Hunkins is a member of the Tort Litigation and Judiciary Section of the Division of Law. He prepares tort cases for trial, including conducting investigations, answering interrogatories, preparing witnesses for depositions, deposing opposing witnesses, consulting experts, deposing experts, and drafting dispositive motions. Before joining DOL, DAG Hunkins was a defense litigator for 28 years, primarily concentrating in medical malpractice defense. He tried 28 cases to verdict. DAG Hunkins holds an undergraduate degree from Rutgers College and a J.D. from Rutgers Law School, Camden.
