Program Summary

This intensive trial advocacy program consists of participatory workshops designed to improve attorneys' litigation skills. Students will present opening and closing arguments, examine witnesses and introduce exhibits. After demonstrating each phase of the trial process, students will receive feedback from experienced deputy and assistant attorneys general and other attorneys with extensive trial experience. The program will conclude with participants conducting a mock trial.

Eligibility

This program is for new Division of Law deputies selected to attend by Division leadership.

Faculty

The faculty consists of Division of Law deputy and assistant attorneys general and other attorneys who have extensive trial experience.
