Program Summary

This program will provide a broad overview of the law pertaining to jail credit, gap-time credit, Rosado credit, commutation credit, earned work credit, and earned minimum custody credit. The presenters will also examine how these types of credits affect parole eligibility, as well as how credits apply to consecutive or multiple sentences.

Eligibility

This program is open to County Prosecutors and Assistant Prosecutors and Deputy Attorneys General in the Department of Law and Public Safety's Division of Criminal Justice.

Faculty

DAG Daniel I. Bornstein retired from the Division of Criminal Justice in October 2020 but returned in February 2024 to work part-time as a Deputy Attorney General in the Major Threats Bureau, with a particular focus on auto-theft crimes. Prior to his retirement, DAG Bornstein was an AAG who served as Counsel to the Director of DCJ and Chief Litigation Counsel for DCJ. Prior to that, he was Chief of DCJ's Appellate Bureau, where he managed all criminal appeals in New Jersey and provided trial and appellate assistance to prosecutors across the State. As a member of the Appellate Bureau, Mr. Bornstein handled dozens of cases before the New Jersey Supreme Court and several hundred before the Appellate Division. He also served in the Gangs & Organized Crime Bureau, where he successfully prosecuted and tried cases involving homicide, racketeering, weapons offenses, and narcotics offenses, including several multi-defendant wiretap cases. Mr. Bornstein graduated *magna cum laude* from Colgate University, received a J.D. from the University of Pennsylvania Law School, and clerked for the Honorable Martin J. Kole, J.A.D., t/a, and the Honorable Theodore A. Winard, J.S.C.

DAG Laura Wojcik serves in the Division of Criminal Justice's Appellate Bureau, where she briefs and argues criminal appeals. Prior to joining the Division, DAG Wojcik clerked for the Honorable Ronald Susswein, J.A.D. She received a B.A., *magna cum laude*, from Colgate University, and a J.D., *cum laude*, from Temple University Beasley School of Law.
