Program Summary

This presentation will focus on the more formal aspects of estate administration, which is the process of distributing the property of a deceased individual to the persons who are designated by the decedent or the application of law to be the recipients of such property. It can involve court-supervised processes, such as formal probate and administration, as well as informal processes, such as the filing of beneficiary claims forms or changing the registration on joint accounts.

Eligibility

This program is open to attorneys in the Department of Law and Public Safety and county prosecutors' offices. This program can be used to satisfy NJ CLE newly admitted lawyers' requirements in the Basic Estate Administration category.
