Program Summary

Legal professionals must manage hundreds of tasks, deadlines and statute of limitation dates related to matters/cases. They receive information and tasks from meetings, depositions, telephone calls, website inquiries, instant messages and email. Capturing and prioritizing these deadlines requires that legal professionals have the proper processes in place. Most have the tools, but lack a methodology or understanding of the technology required to process daily tasks. In this session, students will learn how to capture, clarify, organize and plan tasks so they not only meet all deadlines, but also achieve calm, clarity and focus so they can do their best work. The presenter will provide a method for daily planning, weekly planning and project forecasting that will vastly improve students' level of organization.
