Program Summary

New Jersey county boards and superintendents of elections are responsible for conducting voter registration and elections in compliance with applicable State statutes. This program will provide an overview of election statutory and case law. The presenters will highlight statutes and case law that pertain to common issues that arise during a primary elections in New Jersey, such as voter registration and voter affiliation.

Eligibility

This program is mandatory for Division of Law Deputy Attorneys General hired after October 2024 and deputies who have not attended Election Law in the last two years. Attendance is strongly recommended for deputies who have not been assigned to election duty in the last five years. Other Division of Law deputies are welcome to attend this program.

Faculty
