Program Summary

This program will provide a basic understanding of Megan's Law's two components: registration and notification. Students will learn about offenders' registration obligations, and who is entitled to notification of sex offenders under various circumstances. The presenter will also discuss recent case law, review Parole Supervision/Community Supervision for Life (PSL/CSL), and distinguish between Megan's Law and PSL/CSL.

Eligibility

This program is open to County Prosecutors and Assistant Prosecutors, Assistant and Deputy Attorneys General in the Department of Law and Public Safety's Division of Criminal Justice and law enforcement officers in their respective offices.

Faculty

DAG Emily R. Anderson is the Deputy Attorney General who handles Megan's Law in the New Jersey Division of Criminal Justice. She is assigned to the Prosecutors Supervision Bureau. DAG Anderson has argued Megan's Law issues before the New Jersey Supreme Court and serves as a liaison to various State-wide stakeholders regarding Megan's Law. Prior to this assignment, she worked in DCJ's Appellate Bureau. DAG Anderson clerked for the Honorable Carmen H. Alvarez, P.J.A.D., of the New Jersey Appellate Division. She earned her B.A. from the University of Pennsylvania and her J.D. from Rutgers School of Law – Newark.
