#### What is a Bias Incident?

A bias incident or bias crime is an unlawful act against a person or property (public or private) based on race, color, religion, gender, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, and/or national origin.

### What should you do if you are the victim of, or witness, a Bias Incident?

You should first report any and all suspected or confirmed bias incidents to your local police department. If this is an emergency or a crime in progress call 911 immediately.

# What if I'm uncomfortable reporting to my local police department?

You can report to your County Prosecutor's Office. In New Jersey, each County Prosecutor's Office has a Bias Crimes Unit. Detectives assigned to these specialized units are responsible for receiving reports and investigating all bias incidents. # Do I have to give my name and contact information? What do I need to report?

No, you do not have to give your name or contact information, you can report anonymously. The only information you are required to provide to report a bias incident is the information you want to provide. However, the more information you provide law enforcement, the better their ability to investigate.
