Re: JOINT PETITION OF RESORTS DIGITAL GAMING, LLC AND NETENT AMERICAS, LLC TO CONDUCT INTERNET GAMING RELATED BUSINESS PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 5:12-92a(1) (PRN 3441601)

Dear Mr. Moles and Mr. Kleiman:

The Division of Gaming Enforcement ("Division") has completed its review of PRN 3441601 which seeks authorization to renew PRN 1601601, for NetEnt Americas, LLC, an applicant for casino service industry enterprise licensure, to continue to conduct internet gaming related business transactions with Resorts Digital Gaming, LLC (holder of Internet Gaming Permit NJIGP 15-008), pursuant to an October 13, 2015 Software Licensing Agreement.

Therefore, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:12-92a(1) and N.J.A.C. 13:69J-1.2B, and for good cause shown, internet gaming related business transactions between the petitioners are deemed to be approved for a term to expire June 14, 2017, subject to final approval of the Internet Gaming System by the Division's Technical Services Bureau as authorized by the entry of an Order Granting Approval for Use of Internet Gaming System by the Director and subject further to the representations contained within the joint petition. This approval is further subject to each games submission's approval as required by the Division's Technical Services Bureau. It is further provided that any new business transacted pursuant to this approval be reported to the Division within the time frames set forth in N.J.A.C. 13:69J-1.2B(a)1iv. Further, petitioners must maintain and make available for inspection, upon demand by the Division, any records regarding the business transacted. Moreover, any changes to the current agreement must be reported to the Division within five (5) business days. The Division may reconsider the granting of this approval at any time.
