Take notice that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1, the rules at N.J.A.C. 13:86A will expire on May 19, 2015. The rules established guidelines for awarding grants to municipalities and counties with pedestrian safety problems by the Division of Highway Traffic Safety. Monies in the fund come from fines imposed for violation of the pedestrian safety statute, N.J.S.A. 39:4-36. Grants may be awarded to municipalities or counties for projects involving the enforcement, educational or other remedial steps to address pe3destrian safety problems identified in an application for a grant. Priority is given to municipalities and counties requesting funds in order to take remedial steps for intersections under their authority that have been identified by the New Jersey Department of Transportation as demonstrating pedestrian safety problems. Grants are awarded on a reimbursement basis. Notice of the amount of funds available is published annually in March in the New Jersey Register.

The Division of Highway Traffic Safety has reviewed the rules and has determined them to be necessary, reasonable, and proper for the purpose for which they were originally promulgated, as required by Executive Order No. 66 (1978). Therefore, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-36.2, and in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1.c(1), these rules are readopted and shall continue in effect for a seven-year period.
