<u>DUTIES</u>: Under the direction of the Director of the Division of Law or other supervisory official in the Division, assists with administrative activities necessary for the efficient functioning of the Division with specific emphasis on the Affirmative Civil Enforcement Practice Group ("ACE PG"); works on policy and guidance for statewide affirmative initiatives and priority projects advanced by ACE PG; performs work of a complex nature concerning areas related to ACE PG; assists with interpretation and analysis of law, regulations and other official instrumentalities; performs extensive research and writing on complex legal issues; performs other related duties as assigned or required.

REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited law school with a Juris Doctor. Admission to practice as an Attorney at Law in the State of New Jersey is required.

EXPERIENCE: Four (4) years of experience as a practicing attorney, one (1) year of which shall have been in a supervisory capacity.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform the essential duties of the position.

<u>RESUME NOTE</u>: Eligibility determinations will be based upon information presented in resume only. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide an evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency prior to the closing date. Failure to do so will result in your ineligibility.

If qualified, applicants must complete a Division of Law attorney application for employment, found at www.nj.gov/oag/dolhiring. While completing the application you will be instructed to upload supporting documents including but not limited to: a resume, cover letter indicating interest in vacancy #20-136, a copy of your Certificate of Good Standing with the Supreme Court of New Jersey, a legal writing sample (unedited by others), a copy of your unofficial law school transcripts (self-prepared transcripts are not accepted), and an Affirmative Action form. All items must be submitted together, in one package, on or before the closing date of <u>April 24, 2020.</u>
