DUTIES: Under direction of the Deputy Executive Director of Programs, assists in the overall administration and management practices of assigned component programs related to parole, aftercare, classification, education, and placement assessments, detention practices and risk management initiatives, and directs the planning, coordination, and implementation of designed community programs to educate, rehabilitate, and develop juvenile offenders to become productive members of society; performs other related duties as required.

REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited college or university with a Bachelor's degree supplemented by a Master's degree in Sociology, Psychology, Social Work/Administration, Education, Guidance and Counseling, Penology, Criminal Justice, Public Administration, or related subject of study.

EXPERIENCE: Five (5) years of program experience in the field of juvenile justice/social work administration or coordination of community-based programs in the orientation, training, treatment, education, and rehabilitation efforts of socially maladjusted and/or juvenile offenders, four (4) years of which shall have involved the management of a large-scale social service agency, juvenile justice organization, or troubled adolescent outreach community services program.

NOTE: Applicants who do not possess the required education may substitute additional program experience as indicated above on a year-for-year basis for the Bachelor's degree, with thirty (30) semester hour credits being equal to one (1) year of college, and two (2) additional years of program experience for the Master's degree.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey, only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform the essential duties of the position.
