DUTIES: Under the direction of a Director, or other supervisory official in the Juvenile Justice Commission, is responsible for the overall management of all phases of an assigned major program including planning, organizing and coordinating activities in the following areas; Community Programs, Substance Abuse, Classification, Juvenile Parole and Aftercare Services, Community Partnership, Court Liaison; performs related managerial assignments as required.

REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited college or university with a Bachelor's degree.

EXPERIENCE: Five (5) years of experience in the field of juvenile justice, or in a program having responsibility to analyze, develop or implement social, community, or youth services, two (2) years of which shall have been in a supervisory capacity.

NOTE: Applications who do not possess the required education may substitute additional experience as indicated above on a year- for-year basis.

NOTE: A Master's degree in Sociology, Psychology, Social Work, Education, Guidance, Counseling, Criminology, Criminal Justice or Public Administration may be substituted for one (1) year of the nonsupervisory experience.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform the essential duties of the position.
