NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: Two (2). Location preference required.

DUTIES: Under the direction of a Bureau Chief, Deputy Bureau Chief, Deputy Director, Director or other supervisory official in the Division of Criminal Justice (“the Division”), Department of Law and Public Safety (“LPS”), conducts work in the Financial and Cyber Crimes Bureau (the “Bureau”), which focuses on preventing, investigating and prosecuting economic and technology-based crimes. The Bureau investigates and prosecutes crimes involving money laundering, identity theft, bank fraud, tax fraud, mortgage fraud, securities fraud, consumer fraud, elder fraud, and a variety of complex theft schemes, as well as technology-based crimes, including network intrusions, denials of service, malware, and other forms of cyber-attacks. Further, the Bureau prioritizes child exploitation crimes and investigations of online predators, working directly with the State Police Internet Crimes Against Children Unit and other task forces. This Deputy Attorney General will interpret and enforce laws and regulations; participates in legal and related activities involving federal and local jurisdictions and other State entities; drafts memoranda of law; handles all aspects of case litigation, including but not limited to case assessment, research, discovery coordination, grand jury presentations, court appearances, pre-trial preparation, trial practice, court filings (motions, briefs, sentencing documents), attorney correspondence and case management; serves on various task forces and working groups for the Division or LPS; works on special projects and initiatives; and performs other related work as needed.

REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited law school with a Juris Doctor. Admission to practice as an Attorney at Law in the State of New Jersey is required.

EXPERIENCE:

DEPUTY ATTORNEY GENERAL 4: Two (2) years of experience as a practicing attorney.

DEPUTY ATTORNEY GENERAL 3: Three (3) years of experience as a practicing attorney.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey.

SPECIAL NOTE: Current Department employees appointed to a Deputy Attorney General 4 or Deputy Attorney General 3 title must be willing to accept a lateral transfer, if selected.

SALARY NOTE: For newly hired individuals, the starting salary and title will be determined by the Department commensurate with experience. Salary offers and titles are non-negotiable and will fall within the range posted.

PREFERENCE: Preference will be given to candidates who possess at least five (5) years of criminal litigation experience, including both jury and bench trials, as well as demonstrated experience in examining financial records, utilizing various financial databases and compiling detailed findings and conclusions, or candidates who have experience and/or training in digital and mobile forensics and who have developed and presented complex technical evidence in criminal cases.

RESUME NOTE: Eligibility determinations will be based upon information presented in resume only. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide an evaluation indicating its U.S. equivalency prior to the closing date. Failure to do so may result in your ineligibility.

All offers of employment are conditional subject to the applicant agreeing to and then passing a background check that may include fingerprinting.
