DUTIES: Under direction of the Bureau Chief or Deputy Bureau Chief in the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit, Office of the Insurance Fraud Prosecutor (OIFP), Department of Law and Public Safety, represents OIFP as counsel in legal proceedings; with a particular focus on False Claims Act litigation; participates in the planning, development and organization of the work programs involved in the detection and prosecution of criminal activities; interprets and enforces laws or regulations; as the Attorney General's representative, participates in legal and related activities involving federal and local jurisdictions and other State entities; performs other related duties as required.

REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited law school with a Juris Doctor. Admission to practice as an Attorney at Law in the State of New Jersey is required.

EXPERIENCE:

DEPUTY ATTORNEY GENERAL 4: Two (2) years of experience as a practicing attorney.

DEPUTY ATTORNEY GENERAL 3: Three (3) years of experience as a practicing attorney.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey.

***SALARY NOTE:** For newly hired individuals, the starting salary and title will be determined by the Department commensurate with experience. Salary offers are non-negotiable and will fall within the range posted.

SPECIAL NOTE: Current Department employees appointed to a Deputy Attorney General 4 or Deputy Attorney General 3 title must be willing to accept a lateral transfer, if selected.

PREFERENCE: Preference will be given to applicants with civil litigation experience.

RESUME NOTE: Eligibility determinations will be based upon information presented in resume only. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide an evaluation indicating its U.S. equivalency prior to the closing date. Failure to do so may result in your ineligibility.
