**DUTIES:** Under general supervision of a supervisory official within the Office of Insurance Fraud Prosecutor, Medicaid Fraud Control Unit will produce consistent and quality results for False Claim Act data requests meeting all deadlines. Analyze and run SDW queries for multi-state data requests. Analyze records for criminal investigations. Works with trial teams to produce analysis of records for use in criminal investigations. Performs duties of significant difficulty regarding False Claims Act litigation, conducts thorough complex audits, supervises and coordinates concurrent audit efforts in performing financial and operational audits at all levels regarding False Claims Act in which considerable difficulty is encountered. Prepares internal control data mining questionnaires and audit programs; prepares staff training materials and teaches course material regarding claims analysis and data mining. Prepares reports containing findings, analyses, conclusions and recommendations; performs other related duties required. #### **REQUIREMENTS**

**EDUCATION:** Graduation from an accredited college with a Bachelor's degree.

**EXPERIENCE:** Three (3) years of experience in the conduct of civil or criminal investigations related to compliance, enforcement, detection, and surveillance activity, including the preparation of investigative reports; OR three (3) years of experience in the conduct of investigative administrative audits and/or regulatory examinations of records maintained by businesses and organizations; OR three (3) years of experience in the conduct of investigations for the government, the military, consumer protection programs, public advocacy organizations, or the public interest.

Applicants who do not possess the required education may substitute experience as indicated on a year-for-year basis.

Completion of a supervised internship field placement of 300 hours in an undergraduate curriculum in Criminal Justice or a related degree program may be substituted for one (1) year of the non-supervisory experience. *A copy of your transcript indicating completion of the internship as part of your undergraduate degree program in Criminal Justice or a related field must be provided in order to meet this substitution requirement. Failure to do so may result in disqualification.*

A Juris Doctorate degree or a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice, Public Administration, Business Administration, Law, or other related field may be substituted for one (1) year of the non-supervisory indicated experience.

**LICENSE:** Appointees will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform the essential duties of the position.

**RESUME NOTE:** Eligibility determinations are based upon information presented in resume only. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide an evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency prior to the closing date.
