<u>DUTIES</u>: Under the direction of an investigative supervisor in the Victims of Crime Compensation Office, will receive on-the-job training to process victims of crime benefit claims by interpreting applicable statutes, rules and regulations; reviews law enforcement reports, conducts criminal history record checks, and evaluates victim employment records, Workers' Compensation and State Department of Labor Unemployment information to ascertain compensability and compliance with relevant law; communicates with service providers such as hospitals, physicians, mental health providers; evaluates insurance information and benefits; performs other related duties as required.

REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited college with a Bachelor's degree. Applicants must submit a copy of your final unofficial transcripts, which indicates the date your degree was conferred and the type of degree awarded. Failure to submit final unofficial transcripts with your resume will result in disqualification from consideration. Matriculating students cannot be considered.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is required to perform the essential duties of the position.

PREFERENCE: Preference will be given to candidates with experience working in the fields of anti-violence, social justice, victims'/survivors' rights, and/or trauma-informed services.

RESUME NOTE: Eligibility determinations will be based upon information presented in resume only. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide an evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency prior to the closing date. Failure to do so will result in your ineligibility.
