<u>DUTIES</u>: Under the general supervision of the Director of the Division of Criminal Justice, Legal Chief of the Office of Securities Fraud and Financial Crimes Prosecutions (the Office), or the Office's investigative and prosecutorial leadership team; performs legal research and prepares documents, reports, summaries, correspondence, memoranda and other legal documents; provides a variety of paralegal support to staff, including assisting in all filings, managing case files, and organizing the team's work flow; makes recommendations to be used by legal staff; coordinates discovery; performs trial preparation, including preparation of trial exhibits and exhibit lists; works closely with attorneys and detectives in case preparation; attends and actively assists during court proceedings and trials throughout the State; works with Sanction and other trial presentation software; prepares, reviews and syncs transcripts; sets up trial equipment; schedules witnesses; provides general administrative support; performs other tasks related to litigation preparation and execution; and does related work as required.

REQUIREMENTS:

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited college with a Bachelor's degree.

EXPERIENCE: Two (2) years of paralegal or legal/legislative research experience.

NOTE: Applicants who do not possess the required education may substitute additional experience as indicated above on a year for year

NOTE: A Bachelor's degree in Law may be substituted for both the education and experience requirements listed above.

<u>NOTE</u>: Applicants who do not possess a Bachelor's degree may substitute an Associate's degree as a Legal Assistant or in Paralegal Studies or, successful completion of a two (2) year approved course in Paralegal Training at a recognized educational institution for two (2) years of college education.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey.

PREFERENCE: Preference will be given to applicants who have criminal justice experience, specifically with complex financial investigations and prosecutions; those with data management experience; and a demonstrated ability to review and manage substantial electronic and paper records/files.

RESUME NOTE: Eligibility determinations will be based upon information presented in resume only. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide an evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency prior to the closing date. Failure to do so may result in your ineligibility.
