DUTIES: Under the limited supervision of a Research Data Supervisor or other supervisory official in the Department of Law and Public Safety (DL&PS) Office of Justice Data (OJD), Law Enforcement Professional Standards (OLEPS) or Juvenile Justice Commission (JJC), independently performs a variety of complex tasks which include advanced research and data analysis; collection of data, scheduled report maintenance, and statistical work in one or more programmatic or investigative areas, utilizing structured and unstructured data from existing reports and resources for statewide business improvement; does all related duties as required. REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited college or university with a Bachelor's degree including or supplemented by 18 credits in social sciences, criminal justice, statistics, or a closely related field.

EXPERIENCE: Three (3) years of experience in collecting, analyzing, reporting, and disseminating large volumes of data using statistical techniques to identify trends or patterns in complex data for research projects.

NOTE: Applicants who do not possess the required education may substitute the specialized eighteen (18) credits for the remaining education outlined above on a year-for-year basis.

NOTE: A Master's degree in social sciences, criminal justice, statistics, or a closely related field may be substituted for one (1) year of the required experience.

NOTE: A Ph.D. in social sciences, criminal justice, statistics, or a closely related field may be substituted for two (2) years of the required experience.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform essential duties of the position.

PREFERENCES: Preference will be given to candidates who have completed coursework (education) in the area of juvenile justice and/or youth development. Work experience in at least one of the following areas is preferred: making juvenile justice policy recommendations to stakeholder groups; preparing data and materials for diverse stakeholders, with a focus on offering system improvement recommendations regarding existing and proposed policy; using various types of information technology and technical systems to carry-out job responsibilities, including SPSS, Microsoft Access, and Microsoft Excel.
