NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: One (1)

DUTIES: Under the direction of the Insurance Fraud Prosecutor or Deputy Insurance Fraud Prosecutor, in the Office of the Insurance Fraud Prosecutor (OIFP), Department of Law and Public Safety, is responsible for the management of OIFP's Private Insurance Bureau, both litigation and administrative, and oversight of criminal investigations and the prosecution of all allegations of private insurance fraud (e.g., property or medical) and related crimes; conducts attorney case reviews; supervises and evaluates staff; reviews and approves legal applications and pleadings; interprets and enforces laws and regulations; coordinates activities with federal, state, and local law enforcement partners; oversees OIFP's County Reimbursement Program; and performs other related work as required. This position may also require non-traditional work hours, on an as needed basis, including evenings and weekends on short deadlines for certain assignments, with or without advance notice.

REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited law school with a Juris Doctor. Admission to practice as an Attorney at Law in the State of New Jersey is required.

EXPERIENCE: Five (5) years of experience as a practicing attorney, two (2) years of which shall have been in a supervisory capacity.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey.
