NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: Three (3) - location preference required.

DUTIES: Under limited supervision of the Bureau Chief and Assistant Bureau Chief of the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit, provides analytical support throughout all stages of criminal investigation and trial, including, but not limited to, the following: identifying, examining, and analyzing financial data; employing data mining techniques, when applicable; using appropriate software programs to develop queries and prepare reports that clearly and accurately summarize data and provide written and/or demonstrative analytical work products to investigative teams; reviewing and analyzing financial records, claims data, and other types of evidence collected during the course of investigations; using data repositories to further support the analysis; performing analytical techniques including association, event flow, commodity flow, financial, time series, telephone toll, and statistical analyses, as needed; creating written and/or demonstrative reports of analyses for use by detectives and Deputy Attorneys General (DAsG); preparing tables, graphs, charts, flow diagrams, and free form charts using software programs (IBM i2 Analyst's Notebook, Excel, etc.); synopsizing all data in a concise and accurate manner, relevant to a detective/DAG request; working with detectives and DAsG to assist in the development of investigative plans, subpoenas, and affidavits; and assisting in processing of hotline cases and development of additional information for same via various database checks (ISO, Dept. of Labor, CLEAR, etc.); performs other related duties as required.

REQUIREMENTS

NOTE: Applicants must meet one of the following or a combination of both experience and education. Thirty (30) semester hour credits are equal to one (1) year of relevant experience.

Six (6) years of professional experience in the conduct of civil or criminal investigations related to compliance, enforcement, detection, and surveillance activity, including the preparation of investigative reports.

OR

Six (6) years of professional experience in the conduct of investigative administrative audits and/or regulatory examinations of records maintained by businesses and organizations.

<u>OR</u>

Six (6) years of professional experience in the conduct of investigations for the government, the military, consumer protection programs, public advocacy organizations, or the public interest.

<u>OR</u>

Possession of a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university; and two (2) years of the above-mentioned professional experience.

<u>OR</u>

Possession of a juris doctorate or a master's degree in Criminal Justice, Public Administration, Business Administration, Law, or a related field; and one (1) year of the above-mentioned professional experience.

<u>NOTE</u>: Completion of a supervised internship field placement of 300 hours in an undergraduate curriculum in Criminal Justice or a related degree program may be substituted for one (1) year of the non-supervisory experience.

<u>NOTE</u>: "Professional experience" refers to work that is creative, analytical, evaluative, and interpretive; requires a range and depth of specialized knowledge of the profession's principles, concepts, theories, and practices; and is performed with the authority to act according to one's own judgment and make accurate and informed decisions.

LICENSE: Appointees will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey.
