NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: One (1)

<u>DUTIES</u>: Under limited supervision of the Executive Director, a State Investigator 4 or 3, or other supervisory official within the New Jersey Racing Commission ("NJRC"), will oversee the processing of pari-mutuel wagering by the staff operating the totalisator at the hub facility; will observe all aspects of the processing of wagers at the hub facility to ensure that wagering is handled and ceased in accordance with the requirements of the NJRC's rules; performs other related duties as required.

REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited college or university with a Bachelor's degree.

EXPERIENCE: Three (3) years of experience conducting background or criminal type investigations including the review and analysis of financial and accounting records.

<u>NOTE</u>: Applicants who do not possess the required education may substitute additional experience as required on a year-for-year basis with thirty (30) semester hour credits being equal to one (1) year of experience.

<u>NOTE</u>: A Master's degree or certification as a Certified Public Accountant may be substituted for one (1) year of the indicated experience.

<u>LICENSE</u>: Appointees will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform the essential duties of the position.

RESUME NOTE: Eligibility determinations for experience and education will be based upon the resume and unofficial transcripts submitted at the time of application. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide a CSC approved evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency, with a course-by-course breakdown, prior to the closing date (see <u>CSC foreign degree information</u>). Failure to do so may result in disqualification of your education towards eligibility.
