An opportunity currently exists in the classified service and in the unclassified service with the Department of Law and Public Safety, Office of the Attorney General, for applicants who meet the requirements indicated below:

TITLE: Program Specialist Trainee

Trenton OR Newark, NJ

Statewide travel required for work responsibilities.

NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: Two (2) - Location preference required.

<u>DUTIES</u>: Under the close supervision of a Program Specialist 3, Program Specialist 4, or other supervisory officer in a State department or agency, as a trainee and productive worker, receives on-the-job training while assisting in the professional, administrative, and analytical work to promote the planning, operation, implementation, monitoring and/or evaluation of human or social service programs, programs serving the socio-economic needs of specific clients populations, or regulatory programs designed to ensure public safety, health and welfare, or protection of the environment; completes assignments which provide practical Program Specialist experience; does other related work. This position may also require non-traditional work hours, on an as needed basis, including evenings and weekends on short deadlines for certain assignments, with or without advance notice. REQUIREMENTS

<u>NOTE</u>: Applicants must meet one of the following or a combination of both experience and education. Thirty (30) semester hour credits are equal to one (1) year of relevant experience.

Four (4) years of professional experience relevant to the position.

OR

Possession of a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university.

NOTE: "Professional experience" refers to work that is creative, analytical, evaluative, and interpretive; requires a range and depth of specialized knowledge of the profession's principles, concepts, theories, and practices; and is performed with the authority to act according to one's own judgment and make accurate and informed decisions.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey.

<u>ADVANCEMENT</u>: Appointees who successfully complete the 12-month training program will be eligible for advancement to the title Program Specialist 1. The inability of an employee in a trainee title to attain a level of performance warranting advancement to the title indicated shall be considered cause for separation.

PREFERENCE: Preference will be given to applicants who have experience working with law enforcement, mental health, substance use disorders, or vulnerable populations.

<u>SAME APPLICANTS</u>: If you are applying under the NJ "SAME" program, your Schedule A or B letter must be submitted along with your resume and any other required supporting documents indicated on the announcement by the closing date indicated below. RESUME NOTE: Eligibility determinations for experience and education will be based upon the resume and unofficial transcripts submitted at the time of application. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide a CSC approved evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency, with a course-by-course breakdown, prior to the closing date (see CSC foreign degree information). Failure to do so may result in disqualification of your education towards eligibility.

All offers of employment are conditional subject to the applicant agreeing to and then passing a background check that may include fingerprinting.
