<u>DUTIES</u>: Under the close supervision of a supervisory official in a State department, institution, or agency, performs technical duties and/or performs para-professional responsibilities for prescribed technical projects or programs requiring the independent application of the rules, regulations, policies, and procedures to varying situations within the particular area of assignment; does other related duties as required. REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited college or university with an Associate's degree.

NOTE: Applicants who do not possess the required education may substitute additional experience as indicated on a year-for-year basis with thirty (30) semester hour credits being equal to one (1) year of experience.

EXPERIENCE: One (1) year of experience in providing support to functions such as grant/contract compliance monitoring, program monitoring, or fiscal compliance and budgetary assistance and/or providing technical assistance to state and/or local communities or agencies, completing forms or applications, reviewing documents for accuracy and content, resolving complaints, or interpreting rules, regulations, policies, and procedures for the public, and/or others.

NOTE: Applicants who do not possess the required experience may substitute additional education as indicated on a year-for-year basis with thirty (30) semester hour credits being equal to one (1) year of experience.

<u>LICENSE</u>: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform the essential duties of the position.

RESUME NOTE: Eligibility determinations will be based upon information presented in resume only. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide an evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency prior to the closing date. Failure to do so may result in your ineligibility.

All offers of employment are conditional subject to the applicant agreeing to and then passing a background check that may include fingerprinting.

This position may be eligible to telework for up to two (2) days a week as part of the JJC's Pilot Telework Program as authorized by the Civil Service Commission (CSC).
