DUTIES: Under the direction of a Supervising Investigator or other Supervisory official in the Department of Law and Public Safety, leads an investigative unit or team or coordinates an investigative program, conducting in depth investigative case support to assist local, state and federal law enforcement agencies, utilizing all available analytical and investigative resources and databases, and creating comprehensive intelligence products, analytical assessments, and providing briefings to executive level NJSP and State Government officials.

REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited college with a Bachelor's Degree.

EXPERIENCE: Four (4) years of experience in the conduct of civil or criminal investigations related to compliance, enforcement, detection, and surveillance activity, including the preparation of investigative reports;

OR

Four (4) years of experience in the conduct of investigative administrative audits and/or regulatory examinations of records maintained by businesses and organizations;

OR

Four (4) years of experience in the conduct of investigations for the government, the military, consumer protection programs, public advocacy organizations, or the public interest.

Applicants who do not possess the required education may substitute experience as indicated on a year-for-year basis.

Completion of a supervised internship field placement of 300 hours in an undergraduate curriculum in Criminal Justice or a related degree program may be substituted for one (1) year of the non-supervisory experience.

A Juris Doctorate degree or a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice, Public Administration, Business Administration, Law, or a related field may be substituted for one (1) year of the non-supervisory experience.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is required to perform the essential duties of the position.

RESUME NOTE: Eligibility determinations will be based upon information presented in resume only. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide an evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency prior to the closing date.
