

APPOINTMENT AS SPECIAL COUNSEL FOR COMPLEX LITIGATION AND COUNSELING AND INSURANCE COVERAGE MATTERS

4. With respect to Section 5.1–I: Our firm's environmental group is and may continue to be adverse to the NJ Department of Environmental Protection. How do we account for this work/minimize potential conflicts?

Conflicts are determined on a case-by-case basis in accordance with the New Jersey Rules of Professional Conduct, the Kimmelman letter and the Grewal letter. Notably, submitting a response to the RFQ and being qualified to the pool does

not, in itself, create a conflict.

5. With respect to Exhibit B – Diversity Questionnaire: Please confirm that all other data, under the specific questions about attorneys in the NJ office, should be firmwide.

All demographic data provided should be firmwide within New Jersey, i.e. accounting for all attorneys based at any of the firm's NJ locations.

6. Does the Scope of Services include workers' compensation issues as well as what is currently listed?

It does not.

7. Does the Scope of Services include employment matters and investigations?

Complex Litigation can include any substantive area where sufficiently complex.
