



# New Jersey Bias Incident Report 2021-2022

## Letter from Attorney General Matthew J. Platkin



Dear Governor and Members of the Legislature:

In recent years, there have been record numbers of bias and hate incidents across our Nation.<sup>1</sup>

New Jersey is no exception. The years 2021 and 2022 again showed us that acts of bias and hate have become far too common in our State. In 2021, there were 1,885 reported bias incidents in New Jersey, representing a 30% increase from 2020. Unfortunately, 2022 set yet another record, with 2,211 incidents reported to law enforcement agencies. That is the highest number of bias incidents reported in New Jersey since we began tracking bias incidents in 1994. Among the bias

incidents reported in 2021 and 2022, the Black, Jewish, and LGBTQIA+ communities reported the largest number of bias incidents. This rising tide of bias and hate has a profound effect on all our communities.

That is why I have made combating bias and hate one of my top priorities. The Department of Law and Public Safety and the Office of the Attorney General continue to work tirelessly to address the upward trend in reported bias incidents through enforcement, outreach, education and training, and prevention efforts. We are committed to using every tool at our disposal to tackle this problem head-on and ensure our most vulnerable communities are safe. Our Office has not hesitated to take swift enforcement action when our communities have been targeted. We have also prioritized educating the public on bias incidents, stressing the importance of reporting bias incidents to law enforcement and engaging with communities across the State to prevent bias and hate from spreading.

The increase in reported bias incidents in New Jersey has several key causes. Some of the increase in reported bias incidents over recent years can be attributed to our efforts to make it easier for New Jerseyans to report bias incidents, to encourage residents to file complaints about bias incidents, and to promote prompt reporting by local law enforcement agencies. We also know those are far from the only reasons why bias

incidents continue to rise precipitously across our State. The increase in bias and hate has also been driven by, among other things, the continued proliferation and use of social media as a tool to spread bias and hate, heightened political discord and political rhetoric, the growth of white supremacist and other extremist ideologies and hate groups, backlash to the racial justice movement that emerged in 2020, and the effects of the COVID-19 global pandemic.

This report details reported bias incidents in New Jersey in 2021 and 2022 and supplements the bias incident data produced by the New Jersey State Police. This report would not be possible without the Office of the Attorney General, New Jersey State Police, Division of Criminal Justice, Division on Civil Rights, Office of Justice Data, and the work of law enforcement agencies across the State.

New Jersey residents should never be subject to acts of bias or hate because of where they are from, what they look like, who they love, or how they worship. This report underscores that there is still much more work to do to stem the tide of bias and hate in New Jersey. And we must all do that work together. We can only stand up to acts of bias and hate successfully if we stand together.

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## Bias Incident Statistical Summary: At a Glance (2022)

Overview of the 2022 bias incident report<sup>2</sup>:

- New Jersey law enforcement agencies reported 2,211 bias incidents. Bias incidents increased by 17% compared to 2021 and by 53% compared to 2020.
- Harassment<sup>3</sup> accounted for 53% (1,162) of all bias incidents.
- Destruction, damage, or vandalism accounted for 19% (411) of all bias incidents.
- Racial bias accounted for 59% (1,295) of all bias incidents in 2022.
- Black individuals were the most frequent targets of bias incidents. Anti-Black bias accounted for 45% (1,006) of all bias incidents.
- The Hispanic or Latinx/e community was the ethnic group most frequently targeted by bias incidents, accounting for 6% (138) of all bias incidents.
- The Jewish community was the religious group most frequently targeted by bias incidents, accounting for 20% (450) of all bias incidents.
- Anti-Muslim incidents accounted for 2.8% (61) of all bias incidents.
- Anti-Gay (Male) accounted for 10% (211) of all bias incidents.<sup>4</sup>
- Elementary and secondary schools were the most frequent locations where bias incidents occurred. 20% (451) of bias incidents occurred in elementary and secondary schools.
- Residences/homes were the second most frequent location of bias incidents, accounting for 20% (446) bias incidents.
- A total of 146 arrests (114 adults and 32 youth) were made resulting from bias incidents.

## Bias Incident Statistical Summary: At a Glance (2021)

Overview of the 2021 bias incident report<sup>5</sup>:

- New Jersey law enforcement agencies reported 1,885 bias incidents. Bias incidents increased by 30% compared to 2020.
- Harassment accounted for 52% (979) of all bias incidents.
- Destruction, damage, or vandalism accounted for 16% (309) of all bias incidents.
- Racial bias accounted for 63% (1,191) of all bias incidents in 2021.
- Black individuals were the most frequent targets of bias incidents. Anti-Black bias accounted for 47% (883) bias incidents.
- The Hispanic or Latinx/e community was the ethnic group most frequently targeted by bias incidents, accounting for 6% (109) of all bias incidents.
- The Jewish community was the religious group most frequently targeted by bias incidents, accounting for 350 or 19% of all bias incidents.
- Anti-Muslim incidents accounted for 2.3% (44) of all bias incidents.
- Anti-Gay (Male) accounted for 9% (174) of all bias incidents.
- Residences/homes were the most frequent locations of bias incidents in 2021. 22% (416) of bias incidents occurred in residences/homes.
- A total of 150 arrests (131 adults and 19 youth) were made resulting from bias incidents.

## Introduction

Consistent with national trends<sup>6</sup>, in 2022, New Jersey set a record for its highest annual number of reported bias incidents since the State began reporting bias incidents nearly three decades ago. There were 2,211 reported bias incidents in 2022, eclipsing the previous record of 1,885 set in 2021. The year 2022 was the seventh consecutive year that the number of reported bias incidents in New Jersey has risen. The number of reported bias incidents has more than quadrupled in the last five years—up from 549 in 2017.

The data underscores what so many residents already know: The tide of hate is rising, affecting nearly every community in New Jersey. As has been the case every year since 2006, Black individuals were once again the most frequent target of bias incidents. In 2021, anti-Black racism was a reported motivation for a bias incident 883 times. That number jumped to 1,006 in 2022—accounting for about 45 percent of all reported motivations for a bias incident. But there has also been a rapid increase in the number of bias incidents targeting other communities. Jewish people remained the religious group most frequently targeted in reported bias incidents in 2022: Anti-Jewish bias was a reported motivation for a reported bias incident 450 times in 2022, representing a 29 percent increase over 2021. And the number of anti-Hispanic or Latinx/e, anti-LGBTQ+, and anti-Muslim bias incidents has also risen rapidly since 2020.

In recent years, the rise in bias incidents has had a particularly profound effect on young people in New Jersey. In 2022, elementary and secondary schools, colleges, and universities were the most frequent locations where reported bias incidents occurred. Indeed, nearly a quarter of all reported bias incidents in 2022 occurred in those locations. The data highlights that bias incidents too often threaten the safe and inclusive learning environment students deserve.

Some of the increase in reported bias incidents across all groups is likely due to improved reporting. But that is only one part of the story.

The rise of social media has played a particularly significant role in contributing to the rise in bias incidents across the country as those who seek to spread hate and extremists' ideologies use social media platforms to do so.<sup>7</sup> Social media has provided those who perpetrate bias with a platform to spread bias and hate—often without consequence. In some cases, when social media companies permit the spread of bias and hate on their platforms, they may be violating their own terms of service, which require them to moderate content and prevent racist or violent content from being spread on their platforms. Hateful content spreads rapidly on social media, normalizing bias among those who view it. Young people are at particular risk of being exposed to and influenced by that content, and they may also face bias-based harassment on social media and other online platforms.

Other factors have also contributed to the stark rise in reported bias incidents, including backlash against the global racial justice movement that began in 2020, political divisiveness and extreme rhetoric from influential leaders, and the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Political discord and extremist rhetoric have galvanized hate groups and white supremacist groups across the country. The nation's current political climate has led to rhetoric that may at times be uncivil and demeaning, and that often includes stereotypes of immigrants, people of color, religious minorities, members of the LGBTQIA+ community, and others. Moreover, as noted in a recent Division on Civil Rights report titled "Exposing White Supremacy in New Jersey,"<sup>8</sup> white supremacist recruitment and violence has had a profound and painful impact on targeted communities, especially on young people. As the report explains, white supremacist violent extremists have pursued a deliberate strategy to blend white supremacist ideologies into mainstream society, which in turn has contributed to the normalization of bigotry and bias.

During and after the COVID-19 pandemic, there was also a significant rise in anti-Asian and anti-Black bias incidents, most likely due to widespread misinformation and political rhetoric from national political leaders. The social and psychological challenges posed by the pandemic cannot be overstated. These challenges have exacerbated existing divisions in our society and exposed individual and collective vulnerabilities that have led to increased bias.

This report and the attached appendices provide essential data that can help us all understand the challenges that hate continues to pose. The report presents a snapshot of some key data from the bias incidents reported across our State in 2021 and 2022, and the accompanying appendices provide a more detailed look at the data. The statistics in this report and the appendices, however, do not reflect the full reality of hate in our State. Many bias incidents are not reported, whether due to a lack of trust in law enforcement, lack of reporting access, fear of reprisal, or other systemic or cultural factors. It is therefore critical that the State continue its work to build trust and encourage reporting of bias incidents.

Ultimately, the report makes clear the urgent need for action to dismantle bias and hate in the State. As bias incidents continue to rise rapidly, this report provides critical data that must inform ongoing efforts to stem the tide of hate in New Jersey.

## Defining and Reporting Bias Incidents

To understand the data provided in this report, we must begin with a common understanding of bias incidents and bias crimes. A bias incident is any act that occurs against a person or property (public or private) based on the protected classes enumerated in New Jersey's laws regarding bias incidents, including but not limited to the following classes: race or color; religion or creed; national origin, nationality, or ancestry; gender; sexual orientation; gender identity or expression; disability, and other protected characteristics.<sup>9</sup>

In New Jersey, a bias or hate crime is known as the crime of Bias Intimidation defined at N.J.S.A. 2C:16-1. A bias crime occurs when an offender commits a specified predicate crime (i.e., Homicide; Assault & Aggravated Assault; Kidnapping; Sexual Assault; Robbery; Arson & Criminal Mischief; Burglary; Harassment; and Weapons Offenses), with a purpose to intimidate a member of a protected class; or knowing that the conduct would intimidate a member of a protected class<sup>10</sup>. Importantly, all bias crimes are bias incidents, but not all bias incidents are bias crimes. For a bias incident to rise to the level of a bias crime, there must be a predicate criminal offense committed because of a bias motivation.

Reporting bias incidents in New Jersey is conducted pursuant to protocols known as Bias Incident Investigation Standards<sup>11</sup>. These Standards clarify the procedures for investigating and reporting bias incidents. The Standards require that local law enforcement agencies report all suspected or confirmed bias incidents through the Electronic Uniform Crime Reporting (eUCR) system as soon as practicable, but not more than 24 hours from the initial law enforcement response<sup>12</sup>. Once reported, each bias incident is reviewed by law enforcement at many levels, including the local police department, New Jersey State Police, the County Prosecutor's Office, the Office of Homeland Security & Preparedness, and the Office of the Attorney General. These layers of review ensure that bias incidents are investigated thoroughly, properly, and promptly.

In 2020, the Division on Civil Rights (DCR) and the Division of Criminal Justice (DCJ) launched NJBIAS, an online reporting portal for both civil and criminal bias-based incidents. The portal allows residents to file complaints alleging bias or discrimination. The NJBIAS portal, available to the public at <https://bias.njcivilrights.gov>, allows residents to report allegations of bias any time and from anywhere. New Jerseyans may also report bias incidents to their local police department or call 911 if they are in immediate danger. If someone wishes to report anonymously, they may call the Attorney General's Office's Bias Hotline at 1 (800) 277-BIAS (2427) or complete an online complaint form via the NJBIAS Portal. The Office of the Attorney General closely monitors all bias incidents reported using these approaches.

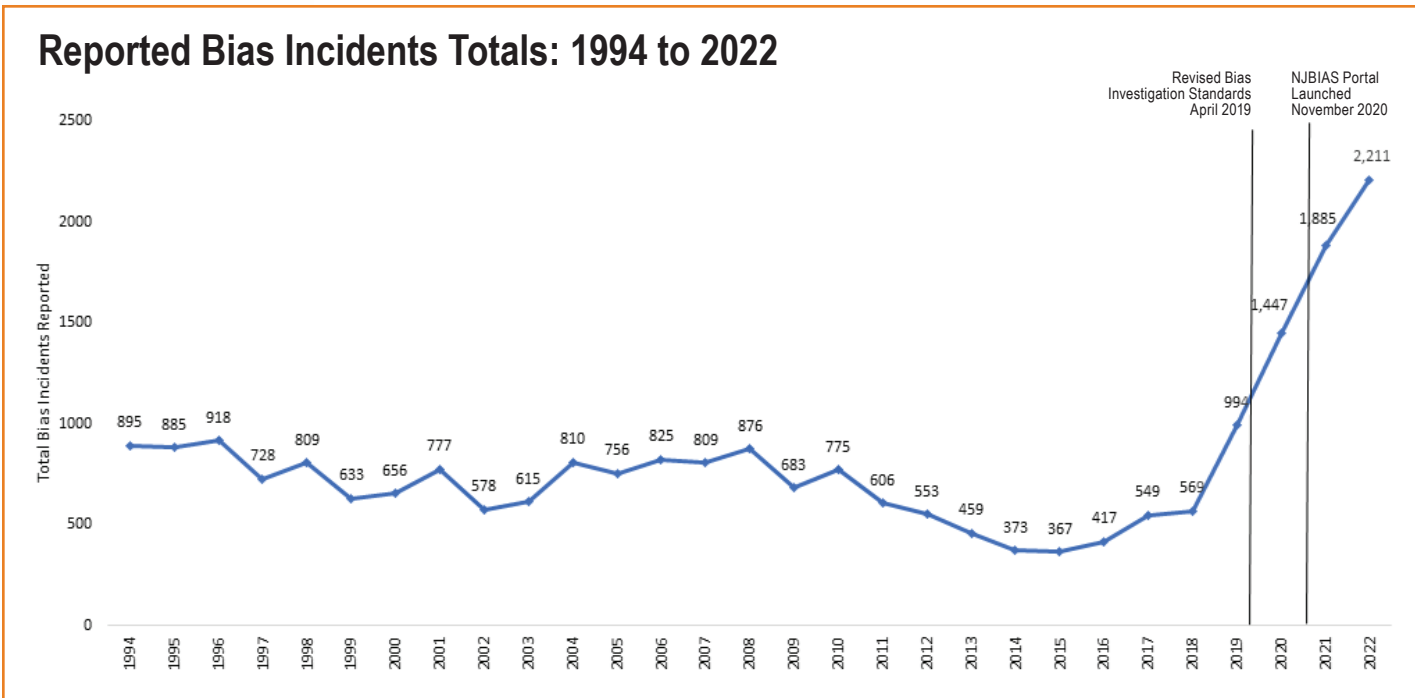

## A Snapshot of Key Statistics on Reported Bias Incidents

As noted above, this report provides data based on 2021 and 2022 bias incident reports submitted to the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting System by every New Jersey law enforcement agency pursuant to New Jersey’s Bias Incident Investigation Standards.<sup>13</sup>

Unfortunately, the data paints a troubling picture: bias remains on the rise in New Jersey. As shown in the chart below, over the past two years, there has been a significant uptick in bias incidents across the State. According to the bias incident data reported for January 2022 to December 2022, there were 2,211 reported bias incidents. That is the highest number of bias incidents recorded in a single year since New Jersey began reporting bias incidents in 1994, and reflects a 17 percent increase over 2021, when New Jersey law enforcement agencies reported 1,885 bias incidents.

The steady climb in the number of reported bias incidents continues an unfortunate trend. The number of bias incidents began steadily increasing in 2019, in the wake of the issuance of the Bias Incident Investigation Standards, and has continued to increase following the implementation of the online NJBIAS reporting portal in late 2020. Indeed, the number of reported bias incidents has nearly quadrupled since 2018.

### *Bias Offense Types and Bias Motivations*

Bias incidents and bias crimes take many forms, ranging from racially-motivated graffiti to threats of physical harm to aggravated assault and in rare instances even murder. Bias incidents most commonly involve harassment, vandalism, and intimidation. In 2021 and 2022, bias-based harassment offenses were the most reported type of offense, as shown in the table below. In 2021, there were 979 reported harassment offenses, and 1,162 in 2022.

Because a single bias incident can be motivated by one or more different types of bias (i.e., a person can be targeted because of their race and gender), the number of reported bias motivations exceeds the total number of reported bias incidents. The 2,640 and 2,265 bias motivations for 2022 and 2021, respectively, are broken down as follows in the chart below.

In both 2022 and 2021, reported bias incidents were most frequently motivated by anti-Black, anti-Jewish, anti-Gay and anti-Asian animus. Anti-Black racism remained the most frequent motivation for bias incidents by far in New Jersey, as has been the case every year from 2006 to 2020. Anti-Black racism was a reported motivation for a reported bias incident 883 times in 2021, accounting for 47 percent of all bias incidents in 2021. That number increased in 2022 to 1,006 bias incidents.

Jewish people remained the religious group most frequently targeted in reported bias incidents in 2022 and 2021. Specifically, anti-Jewish bias was a reported motivation for reported bias incidents 350 times in 2021 and 450 times in 2022, nearly a 30 percent increase year over year.<sup>14</sup>

Anti-Gay bias against gay males was the most frequently reported motivation for reported sexual orientation-based bias incidents. Bias against gay males was reported as a motivation for a reported bias incident 174 times in 2021 and 211 times in 2022, a 20 percent increase in one year alone.

Anti-Asian racism was a reported motivation for reported bias incidents 111 times in 2022, compared to with 130 times in 2021. While the 2022 number represents a slight decrease, anti-Asian bias still accounted for over 4 percent of all bias motivations in 2022.

### *Location of Bias Incidents*

In 2021, residences and homes were the most frequent location of bias incidents. In 2022, elementary and secondary schools became the most common location for bias incidents. Indeed, nearly a quarter of all reported bias incidents in 2022 occurred in elementary and secondary schools.<sup>15</sup> The significant uptick in reported bias incidents occurring in or around schools in recent years is likely a result of the mandatory reporting requirement placed on schools to report all suspected bias incidents to law enforcement. The proliferation of social media use and the spread of bias and hate in cyberspace has also likely contributed to the increase in bias incidents in schools.<sup>16</sup>

In 2021, New Jersey State Police began for the first time to separately track incidents occurring in cyberspace—incidents that were previously classified as “other/unknown.” In 2021, there were 277 reported bias incidents occurring in cyberspace—roughly 15 percent of all reported incidents. In 2022, there were 210 incidents occurring in cyberspace.

### *Bias Incidents by County*

From 2021 to 2022, twelve counties reported an increase in the number of reported bias incidents. Those counties included: Bergen, Burlington, Camden, Hunterdon, Mercer, Middlesex, Monmouth, Ocean, Passaic, Sussex, Union, and Warren. Cumberland, Salem, and Gloucester counties reported no change in the number of bias incidents year over year. Only Cape May, Somerset, Morris, Essex, Atlantic, and Hudson counties reported decreases in the number of reported bias incidents:

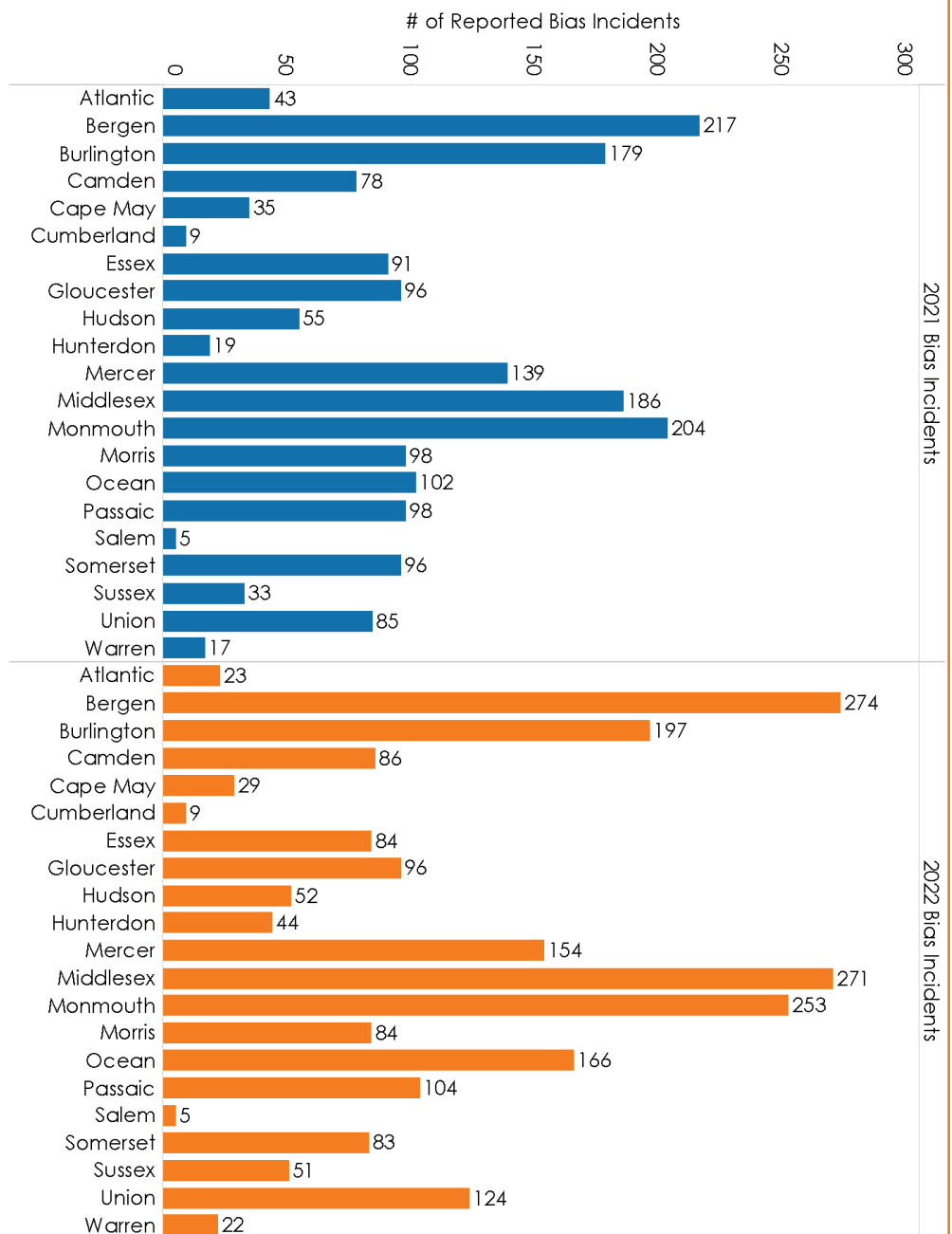
- Atlantic County reported a decrease from 43 to 23 incidents;
- Morris County reported a decrease from 98 to 84 incidents;
- Somerset County reported a decrease from 96 to 83 incidents;
- Cape May County reported a decrease from 35 to 29 incidents; and
- Hudson County reported a decrease from 55 to 52 incidents.

Hunterdon, Ocean, and Sussex counties had the largest proportional increase in 2022 compared to 2021:

- The number of reported bias incidents in Hunterdon County increased more than 130 percent—from 19 bias incidents in 2021 to 44 in 2022;
- In Ocean County, the proportional increase for 2022 was more than 60 percent, increasing to 166 bias incidents in 2022 from 102 in 2021; and
- In Sussex County, the proportional increase was 55 percent, increasing to 51 bias incidents in 2022 from 33 bias incidents in 2021.

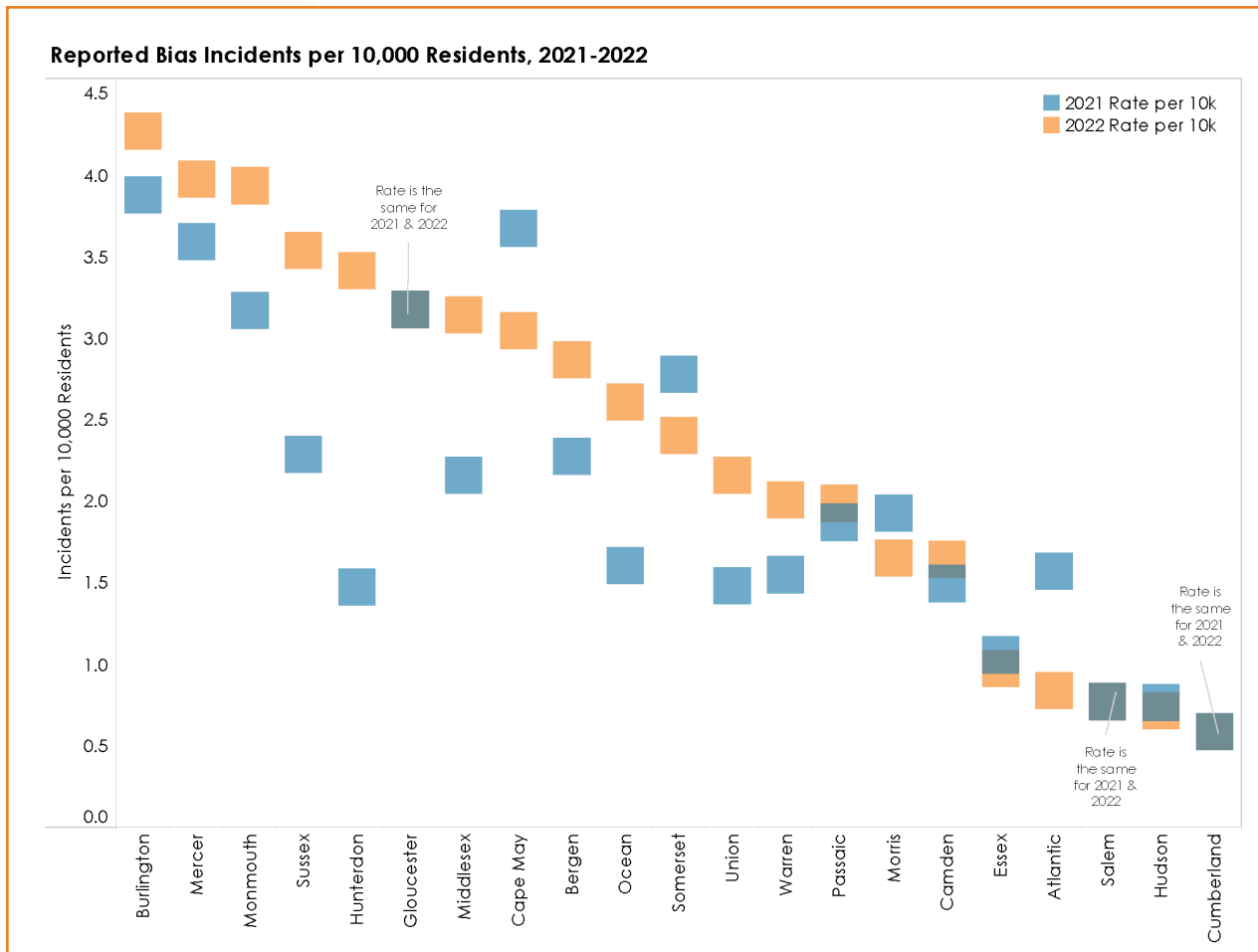


### Reported Bias Incidents by County, 2021-2022



Standardizing the volume of bias incidents against the county population, Mercer and Burlington counties reported the highest rate of reported bias incidents per capita in 2022, with 4.3 and 4.2 reported bias incidents per 10,000 residents, respectively. Monmouth County reported 3.9 bias incidents per 10,000 residents. There were four counties with fewer than one bias incident per 10,000 residents - Salem, Atlantic, Hudson, and Cumberland counties.

The following chart and table show a 2021 to 2022 comparison of reported bias incidents per 10,000 residents in each county in New Jersey, reflecting the change in bias incident volume each year. Taken together with data from previous years, the bias incident rate in each county shows noticeable variations from year to year.



## Statewide Response to the Rise in Bias Incidents

The Office of the Attorney General is taking a Department-wide approach to combating the rising tide of bias and hate across New Jersey.<sup>17</sup>

### *Increased Reporting*

New Jersey has one of the most comprehensive bias incident reporting systems in the Nation, making it easier for residents to report bias incidents. While not every reported bias incident will lead to a criminal case, reporting bias incidents helps inform law enforcement and civil agencies about bias trends and patterns and about the outreach and security measures needed to combat the drivers of bias. When a bias incident does not rise to the level of a criminal case, DCR may investigate these incidents to determine whether a civil enforcement case can be made. The Department actively encourages New Jersey residents to report all incidents of bias. Reporting is an important step in combating bias incidents and ultimately eradicating hate in New Jersey.

### *Outreach and Education*

The Department engages in public outreach and education as part of its prevention efforts to combat bias and hate. DCR, through its Community Relations Unit (CRU) and its Education and Training Unit, regularly conducts statewide "Know Your Rights" trainings relating to bias and discrimination to various community organizations across the State. In direct response to the rise of bias, DCR released a report examining white supremacy in New Jersey. The Report, titled "Exposing White Supremacy in New Jersey,"<sup>18</sup> analyzes the rise in white supremacist recruitment and violence and the profound impact that white supremacy has on targeted communities, especially on young people. The Report also contains a list of best practices that can be used to dismantle white supremacy.

Further, DCR, in partnership with the New Jersey Department of Education and the New Jersey Office of the Secretary of Higher Education, released guidance to aid schools in addressing bias that occurs in or around elementary and secondary schools and on college and university campuses. The guidance documents,

titled, “Addressing Bias in K-12 Schools,”<sup>19</sup> and “Addressing Bias on Campus,”<sup>20</sup> are a resource for schools and others to use to take steps to proactively prevent and respond to instances of bias.

Additionally, DCJ’s Bias Crimes Unit has taken significant steps to engage the community and raise awareness of bias crimes. The Unit has led the State in training sessions and seminars for law enforcement personnel designed to combat bias, including outreach to school resource officers and other school personnel. In May 2023, DCJ launched its official Outreach & Community Services Unit, an initiative dedicated to, among other things, maintaining continual contact with and providing outreach resources to the communities we serve, including also in the area of bias.

Both DCJ and DCR have recently hosted anti-bias education programs at colleges and universities across New Jersey. DCJ, in conjunction with other municipal, county, and state law enforcement partner agencies, has held numerous bias awareness programs for community members, live and virtually. DCJ has continued its robust engagement with New Jersey’s communities on the issue of bias, as it recognizes the role education and communication plays in quelling the recent increase of bias in our State.

The Department has also received two federal grants totaling more than \$1 million to launch a major public awareness campaign about bias and to enhance the state’s reporting services. Implementation of both grant programs is underway.

## Enforcement

The Department is using its civil authority (e.g., consumer protection) to hold tech and social media companies accountable for permitting the spread of bias and hate on their platforms. For those who commit bias incidents, DCR is enforcing its strong civil rights protections and holding violators of the Law Against Discrimination accountable.

DCJ aggressively investigates and prosecutes suspected bias crimes, where appropriate. Bias complaints from the hotline, portal, local or county law enforcement agencies, and the County Prosecutors’ Offices are referred to the Bias Crimes Unit. Thanks to New Jersey’s robust reporting system, the Bias Crimes Unit reviews each reported bias incident to determine if a criminal case can be made.

In addition to the Department’s civil and criminal efforts, the Office of the Attorney General has launched a Racial Justice Initiative, which requires all divisions, agencies, offices and commissions within the Department to identify specific ways they can address and alleviate the racial disparities across the State. Pursuant to an AG Directive, each of the Department’s components must use their broad enforcement and regulatory authorities to promote racial justice across the State.

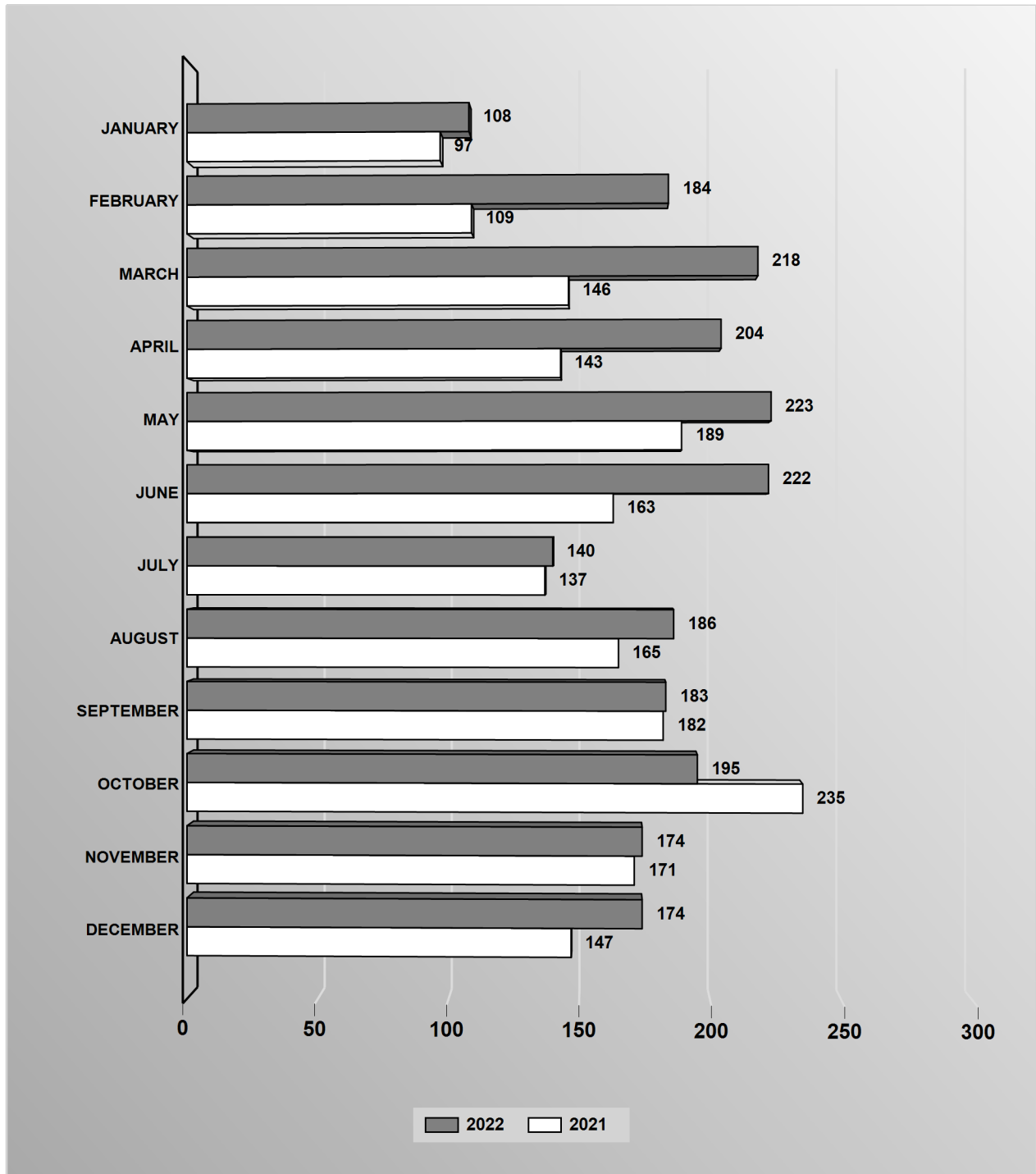
