

LEAD: Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion

A police officer has referred your case to a diversion program, instead of arrest. **Being part of LEAD is always your choice**. LEAD allows police, prosecutors, neighborhoods, and community supports and services to cooperate to ensure that individuals who commit repeated low-level offenses motivated by substance use, mental health, and/or poverty get help with addressing their problems.

LEAD Care Coordinators work with participants to address immediate needs and develop an individual care plan to connect them with community support services, such as;

- housing
- child care services family reconnection
- legal assistance
 - reducing drug use

mental health services

education & employment

- harm reduction
- applying for government benefits
- medications for opioid use disorder
