

DIRECTIVE NO. 2-1999

Claimed Horse - N.J.A.C. 13:71-14.3

N.J.A.C. 13:71-14.3, a provision within the Racing Commission's regulations governing the conduct of simulcasting, provides that: wherever a horse has been claimed, that horse shall not leave the grounds of the meeting of the association where claimed for 60 days following the date of the successful claim unless permission to leave is granted by the Presiding Judge or that meeting ends prior to the expiration of the 60 day time limit.

Effective immediately, permission to leave the grounds shall be granted by the Presiding Judge in the normal course so long as the claimed horse moves to the grounds of any race meeting in New Jersey. Further, the horse may leave the grounds of the racetrack where claimed at any time during the 60 day period, and travel from New Jersey racetrack to New Jersey racetrack, so long as it complies with this in-state requirement. The Presiding Judge may, however, withhold permission for the horse to leave the race meeting where the horse is claimed in those situations where compelling circumstances justifying such are present.

This directive shall take effect immediately.
