## **DIRECTIVE NO. 1-2001**

## **Opening of Pari-Mutuel Windows At New Jersey Outlets**

A New Jersey receiving simulcast facility may open pari-mutuel betting windows for the purposes of accepting wagers on each race program offered where the following conditions precedent are met:

- The receiving New Jersey simulcast hub facility has received all race related information from the host sending track pursuant to an "automatic download," which is verified as complete and accurate by the respective hub tote manager or designee approved to act in such capacity by the Racing Commission ("Commission");
- When the tote systems of the New Jersey receiving guest simulcast facility and host sending track link, all races, pools and runners must be signed on the receivers system logger at the respective hub facility by the individual tote operator assigned to that host venue.

Or, in the absence of an "automatic download," where:

- 1) The New Jersey hub tote manager or Racing Commission approved designee are in receipt of a race program received from a Racing Commission approved "race card clearing house," which race program depicts the entire race card from the host track; and
- The hub tote manager or designee (approved to act in such capacity by the Commission) input the race card into the tote system based upon the program information (i.e., races, pools, and runners) and upon completion, produce a printed pool definition. The printed pool definition is to be verified by both the hub tote manager/designee, and a second qualified tote

employee or qualified representative of the receiving New Jersey guest facility. When both individuals agree that the pool definition matches the program of the host sending track, Racing Commission authorization is given to open pari-mutuel windows for the facility.

When the tote systems of the New Jersey receiving guest simulcast facility and host sending track link after the pari-mutuel windows are opened, all races, pools and runners must be signed on the receivers system logger at the respective hub facility by the individual tote operator assigned to that host venue.

In all cases, logs and pool definitions will be supplied to the Racing Commission Supervisor of Mutuels when completed for purposes of verification that the tote systems of the receiver and host, as well as the races, pools and runners, are in agreement. These reports are to be kept on file for a period of 90 days.
