The Nursing Anne and Mega Code Kelly manikins were installed on 5/28/25. A full onsite training day was provided by Laerdal on 6/4/25. This training was open to all Nursing faculty and staff and was attended by 7 Nursing faculty members. Simulated naloxone training materials were received on 4/28/25 and 6/17/25. In the Fall 2025 semester, this equipment will be integrated into the curriculum. The first semester, 113 generic nursing program students and the eight practical nursing students will utilize the mannikins and naloxone training materials as part of their pharmacology coursework and medication administration competency. The third semester, 68 generic nursing program students and seven LPN-RN students will utilize the manikins and naloxone training materials for
